During these four years, Labour has worked on investment and regeneration projects in Tibshelf such as:

- ✓ New council properties were built on Derwent Drive to meet a local need
- ✓ Local businesses have received help and support through our dedicated free advertising opportunities
- ✓ Established a new Wellness Hub to help those with long-term health conditions and the elderly stay active
- ✓ Worked with developers to provide

better play and recreation facilities on Derwent Drive, Overmoor Drive and Staff Drive

- ✓ Supported local resident groups and lobbied government to stop the HS2 spur which would have impacted on our environment
- ✓ Demolished the problematic flats on the High Street to help pave the way for a new school and better infrastructure
- ✓ Assisted and supported the community to develop the Tibshelf Neighbourhood Plan
- ✓ Introduced the Bolsover District Community Lottery scheme to help local groups and good causes raise valuable funds

This is just a taste of what we have achieved to date and we are continuing to improve and develop our communities all the time. We have big ambitions for Tibshelf and with your help we can make these ambitions become reality.

Our ambitions for Tibshelf

When we are out and about talking to people we get a sense of what is important to you. We feel that over the past four-years, the Labour Bolsover District Council has proven that when they say something, they do it.

They don't use slogans or spin-doctors, just good old fashioned plain English and a commitment to making things happen. So if you elect us, we will continue and build upon this good work and below are the main ambitions that we want to implement for Tibshelf. However, this is not the limit to our ambitions, but just a flavour of some of things you can expect to see happen.

1. Affordable housing

We know there is a shortage of good quality council properties in the Parish. On the back of the successful Derwent Drive scheme, we aim to build more council properties in areas of need through our council-owned company Dragonfly Development Ltd. These properties will be modern, energy efficient and meet a need in the parish. We will also engage with local house builders to purchase properties to help local young people and families get on the housing ladder.



2. Economy

Our local businesses are a key factor in our ambitions to drive up the health and wealth of the area. The majority of these businesses are independent traders and do not have large marketing budgets. We aim to help and support all businesses in the parish by delivering a campaign to encourage people to Shop Local - Spend Local by promoting the current high street offer and providing free marketing opportunities through platforms like digital signage, Bolsover TV and residents publications. We will work with partners to redevelop the high street and petition the Tory controlled county council to make a positive decision on the provision of a new school.

3. Community Safety

We want residents of Tibshelf to feel safe walking in the village at any time of the day or night. We will work with the District Council to install CCTV and deploy mobile CCTV cameras that are linked to a central monitoring suite. We will also increase patrols by the CAN Rangers and Enforcement team to tackle litter and disorder in our communities for the benefit of everyone.





4. Leisure and social activities

We all know how important leisure and open spaces are for our wellbeing so we will look to develop the leisure and recreational activities available to local residents. We will build on the success of the Wellness Hub and look to expand upon the session and activities available. We will develop the playground and recreational facilities in the village. And we will also provide more social and cultural opportunities and events for people to attend that will enhance people's quality of life.

5. Environment

Climate change is always a hot topic and although we can't solve it on our own, we can do our bit to help. So we will continue to help tackle this problem through modern methods of construction in our house and commercial property building programme that will reduce the reliance on gas and encourage sustainability. We will also continue with our tree planting schemes and continually improve our burgundy bin recycling service by offering residents more opportunities to recycle their waste.

6. People and communities

The past three years have not been easy for anyone. The Pandemic, the cost of living crisis and rising household bills are continuing to hit everyone hard. We will continue to provide Warm Spaces for people to attend, offer advice and information on what benefits or help people are entitled to and continue our commitment to promote local voluntary and community groups, helping them attract new members and increase their fundraising efforts through schemes like Bolsover District Community Lottery.
