#### **Providing a new Crematorium**

Preparation work on the new £9million crematorium for the District is progressing well as the planning application has been approved.

The development will be located adjacent to Shirebrook cemetery and is a joint venture between Bolsover District Council and Shirebrook Town Council. The proposed new site will be sympathetically designed to blend into the surroundings and will provide a pleasant, peaceful place for people to visit and reflect.

It will help create up to eight new jobs and will help reduce the time people have to travel to the current crematoriums in Chesterfield and Mansfield.





#### **Building new council properties**

Housing, whether this is for a young family or an elderly relative, is vitally important to us all. We have been investing in providing new council properties as works have now started on building 26 new council homes on Market Close and we have refurbished and are extending Ashbourne Court by another 14 flats to ensure the elderly and vulnerable in our society and cared for and looked after.

### Remembering our mining community

Shirebrook was built on coal and we must never forget this part of our history. That's why we have thrown our full support behind the Shirebrook Colliery Memorial Committee with their campaign to erect a lasting memorial in the Market Place.





#### **Expanding the Robin Hood Line**

The Robin Hood Line is a fantastic travel opportunity that most villages in the area would love to have. We are continuing to work with East Midlands Railway and other partners to develop and extend the line from Shirebrook to Ollerton, providing you with more leisure and professional opportunities as we extend the connectivity in the region.

### Creating growth for the town

We recently asked you for your views about what it is like to live and work in Shirebrook because as a growing town we need a thriving centre. We are working with council officers to collate your ideas and suggestions to develop a Growth Plan that will provide us with opportunities to develop the economic, social and environmental ambitions we all share.



## Our ambitions for Shirebrook

When we are out and about and talking to people we get a sense of what is important to you. So below are the main priorities that you want us to tackle and deliver.

- 1. Leisure Developing the leisure and recreational activities available to local residents through projects such as the ongoing improvement of facilities at Shirebrook Leisure Centre, improving our recreation/play grounds and promoting new clubs and social activities that will enhance people's quality of life.
- **2. Environment** Creating an environment that helps tackle climate change through modern methods of construction, tree planting schemes and continually improving our burgundy bin recycling service to offer residents more opportunities to recycle their waste.
- **3. Growth and connectivity** Deliver the Shirebrook Growth Corridor link road from the M1 J29 to the town which would provide a much improved road infrastructure, provide significant residential and employment land opportunities along its route and has the potential to improve the high street offer in the town through development of the Market Place and increased footfall.
- **4. Improving the rail offer** Expanding the Robin Hood Line to improve connectivity to other towns and villages and increasing the social and economic opportunities available that will increase footfall and improve our local economy.
- **5. Affordable housing** Delivering more affordable housing through the continuation of the Bolsover Homes scheme and purchasing housing from local developers to help local young people and families get on the housing ladder.
